VOICES OF RESILIENCE

2024-2025 was a very productive and intense period for LarkGallery. One highlight was our Voices of Resilience project which was displayed at the Art Against War Festival organized with the non-profit DeepARTment, at the Aziza Gallery and during the WeHo Mishka cultural festival April 27 to May 18, 2025.

The Opening Day of *Voices of Resilience* in the city West Hollywood unfolded as a deeply moving gathering — a global art exhibition and festival illuminating healing, courage, and the unstoppable spark of creative expression. Organized by Lark Pilinsky, curated by Lisa Rasmussen, MFA and juried by Peter Frank. We partnered with the City of West Hollywood, Art is Moving and Harmonia Institute. *Voices of Resilience* event blossomed into a living landscape of beauty, bravery, and transformation.

From the moment guests crossed the threshold, they stepped into the heartbeat of a community that refuses to dim its light. *Voices of Resilience* shimmered with paintings, photographs, poems, and mixed-media works by artists from around the world — each piece a testament to the human capacity to rise through heartbreak, injustice, change, and rebirth. Throughout the day, creativity became the bridge: connecting strangers, awakening memory, and stitching hope back into the fabric of our shared humanity.

Visitors wandered through the artist exhibition, met the creators, explored the Artisan Fair, and gathered in the Community Storytelling Circle — a heart-centered space where personal truth blossomed into collective medicine. Outdoors, the Free Art-Making Tables invited adults, teens, and families into hands-on creative practices themed *Storytelling, Connection, Balance & Unity*, offering a joyful, accessible, and reflective space for shared expression.

During the Closing Reception, the Peter Frank Jury Awards & Honorable Mentions honored artists whose works sparked insight, empathy, and transformation, adding a radiant note of recognition and celebration to the festival.

As a result our artists participated in the spring art-fair and the Le temple des rêves international art show, together with the Palmieri Foundation, both in Lecce, Italy, and in two art retreats in the Italian province of Puglia. Art by the participants of our local and international events in 2024-2025 are included in this online issue of Art & Beyond magazine.

Larkgallery is going through transformational period and working closely on it with NonForProfit "Speaking Creations" organization, helping Immigrant artists to find their voices in United States.

In 2026 we are planning to give our artists opportunities to participate in amazing art exhibition art Art Women in Lecce and art retreats in Puglia province, Italy.

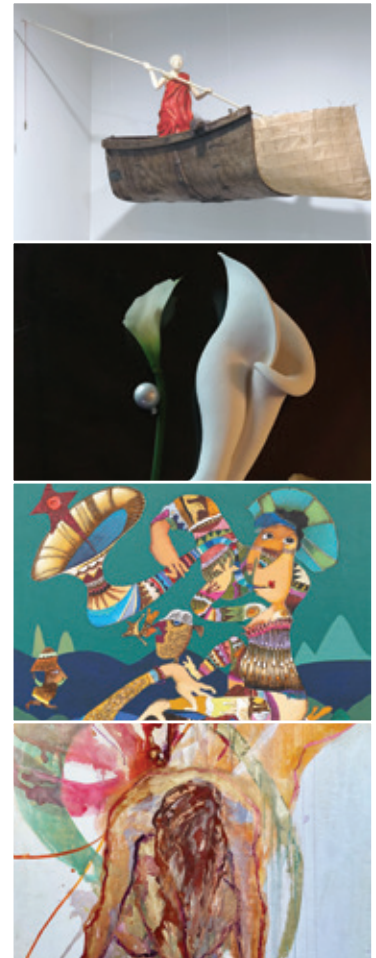
PEACE • RESILIENCE • HARMONY

It is never easy to judge a work born from the creative mind of an artist. Especially when you see so many beautiful ones. Each of them had a special place in the hearts of the jury. But there are rules, and they must be honored. The final choice saw a selection of 13 artists whose works harmoniously intertwine in three words: Peace, Resilience, and Harmony. Only one of these works contains all three words, and that is SANDRA COHN's *Crossing Over* to which the initial cover is dedicated. The work embodies a pivotal juncture, one where we find ourselves immersed, contemplating a transformative journey of passage, leading to a connection with our higher truth. It is a work with a powerful message that is even more urgent in these troubled times.

The back cover is dedicated to ASYA FADEYEVA's work titled *My favorite calla* a composition that explores themes of grace and harmony and adds a delicate balance between nature and artifice, adding depth and poetry to the visual experience.

The first inside cover features GABO with *Ku Ku*, a work overflowing with energy and imagination, harmoniously blending human and animal figures into intricate kaleidoscopic patchworks that convey a sense of joyful movement to the composition.

The last inside cover is dedicated to KOHLENE HENDRICKSON with *She will rise*. A work that conveys a message of resilience and captures the essence of vulnerability, introspection, and personal transformation.

SANDRA COHN



CROSSING OVER. Found Object, Waxed Fiber Paper, Cold finish Porcelain Sculpture, Bamboo, 36" x 11" x 15"

This compelling sculpture, titled '*Crossing Over*' by multidisciplinary American artist SANDRA COHN, depicts a boat suspended in mid-air, carrying a Buddhist monk holding an oar, journeying across a sacred river. The installation, composed of various materials- including found objects, salvaged wood, translucent waxed paper, cold finish porcelain sculpture, and bamboo- evokes the theme of navigation and spiritual journey, emphasizing the exploration of the unknown and the discovery of one's true being.

The balanced design contrasts the heaviness of wood, and the light, sheer glow of paper, creating a captivating visual dialogue both of transition and movement, that is concrete and ethereal, traditional and contemporary. The red of the robe represents the realm of enlightenment, while the fish signifies the connection to the spiritual realm and higher knowledge.

The artist draws inspiration from a Buddhist parable, which portrays a boat representing diverse paths or traditions, that serves as a vessel guiding us to the shore of enlightenment. Regardless of the path or tradition one chooses, the essence is the journey to awakening.

Sandra Cohn's entrancing sculpture embodies a pivotal juncture, one where we find ourselves immersed, contemplating a transformative journey of passage, leading to a connection with our higher truth. Her skill and ability to craft impactful and perceptive pieces is evident throughout her work.

GABO



KU KU. Acrylic Painting on Canvas, 76 cm x 101 cm

Ku Ku is the title of work by Armenian artist GABRIEL MANOUKIAN aka GABO. The work overflows with energy and imagination, harmoniously blending abstract shapes and vibrant colors against a serene backdrop of aqua-green mountains and a tranquil river. The composition features an intricate tapestry of patchwork motifs, reminiscent of a kaleidoscope, where geometric shapes intertwine with organic forms. Human and animal figures intertwine in a lively dance, their stylized yet expressive features exuding a sense of joyful movement. The bold use of gold and earthy tones contrasts harmoniously with cooler hues. Each glance reveals new details, making it a testament to the artist's inventive vision and intricate craftsmanship.

ASYA FADEYEVA



MY FAVORITE CALLA. Ceramic Sculpture, 8" x 23"

This artwork titled *MY FAVORITE CALLA* by ASYA FADEYEVA, presents a striking composition of elegance and form. A central white, elongated shape curves gracefully, evoking a sense of fluidity and movement akin to a dancer's silhouette. Flanking this form are two pristine calla lilies, their slender stems and smooth blooms enhancing the artwork's natural elegance. Scattered around are lustrous, spherical elements resembling pearls, adding a touch of opulence and creating a delicate balance between the natural and the sculptural. The dark background starkly contrasts with the lighter elements, heightening their prominence and adding depth to the visual experience. This piece uniquely combines organic and abstract elements, inviting viewers to explore themes of grace and harmony. The interplay of light and shadow further accentuates the dynamics of the composition, ensuring a captivating and thought-provoking engagement.

This captivating artwork titled *MOLOKAI MAIDENS* by photographer FELICE WILLAT, portrays three figures adorned in vibrant green dresses, standing gracefully in shallow waters during a mesmerizing sunset. The scene is bathed in warm, golden hues, reflecting both the tranquility of the water and the sky's ethereal glow. The figures are thoughtfully arranged, creating a sense of depth and harmony, with each silhouette distinct yet part of a cohesive whole. Their headpieces, adorned with natural elements, enhance the organic theme and cultural richness. IZABEL RAA is an award-winning visual artist and composer whose work bridges the realms of painting, music, and inner transformation. Her paintings explore the dialogue between light and darkness, emotion and cosmic consciousness, blending the visible and the invisible through color and form.

As a composer, Izabel creates atmospheric, cinematic soundscapes that evoke both intimacy and vastness — a

journey through silence, courage, and awakening. Her works have been exhibited internationally, including in the United States, Italy, India, and Russia, and her music is available on major streaming platforms worldwide.

Through all her creations, she seeks to remind us of the beauty of being alive — fragile, mysterious, and infinitely connected to the greater rhythm of the Universe.

INSEPARABLE. Cold Cast Bronze, 15" x 12"

This striking sculpture titled *INSEPARABLE* by KELLY GREER, captures the intimate bond between two figures, crafted in lustrous bronze. The artwork showcases a muscular, confident figure holding an expressive, tender companion. Their intertwined postures, intricately detailed, symbolize unity and support. The textured hair of each figure, with one featuring braided strands and the other with flowing locks, adds depth and movement, enhancing the dynamic between them. Expressive facial features and the use of high-relief embossing bring vitality and emotion to their gazes, while the subtle play of light across the bronze surface accentuates the contours, creating a harmonious balance between strength and sensitivity. This piece invites viewers to contemplate themes of connection and solidarity, making it a compelling representation of human relationships.

YELENA KIMELBLAT



TIRED. Acrylic on Burlap, 38" x 50"

This compelling artwork titled *TIRED* by YELENA KIMELBLAT, presents a nude figure reclining on a rich, burgundy-coloured sofa, exuding a sense of vulnerability and introspection. The figure is outlined with bold, black lines, emphasizing contours and posture, and creating a striking contrast against the muted tones of their skin and the sofa's deep hue. The background is a neutral grey, framing the scene without distraction. Executed on a piece of raw canvas, the texture adds depth and an organic feel to the composition. The use of space is masterful, with the sofa's angular elements juxtaposing the figure's curves. The anonymity of the subject, with their face hidden, invites viewers to explore themes of identity and solitude. The artist's choice to leave the canvas edges visible contributes to its raw, unfinished aesthetic, reinforcing the emotional authenticity of the scene. This piece is a poignant exploration of form, colour, and human emotion.

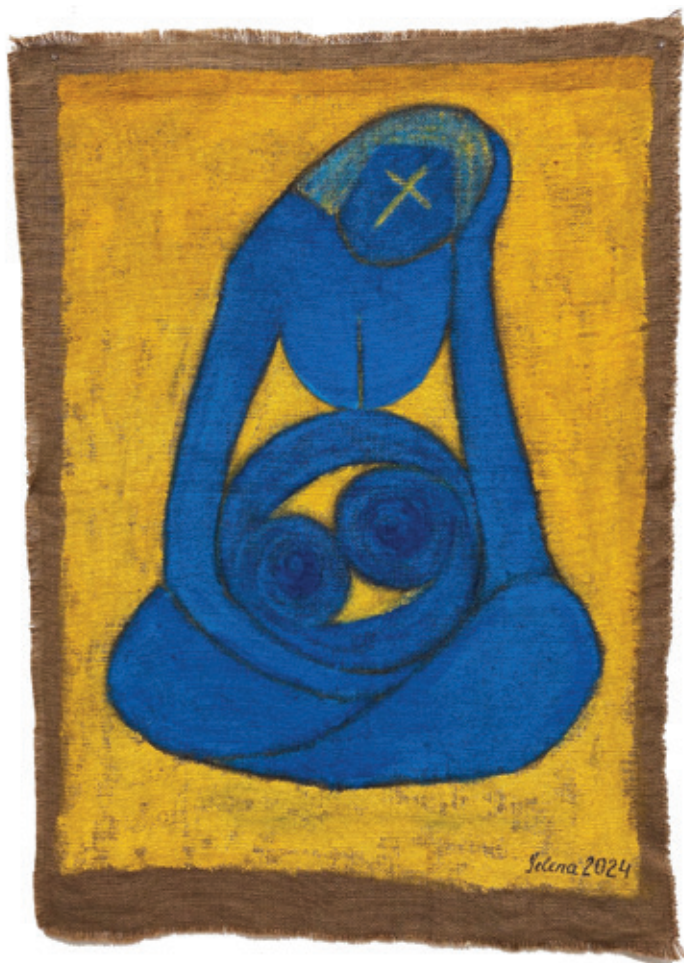
Born in Kyiv, Ukraine, Yelena Kimelblat holds dual Master's degrees in Geophysics and Computer Science. A self-taught American-Ukrainian artist, she began painting in 2008, discovering in art a profound means of expressing her vision of life.

Among the highlights of her career are an Art Residency in Vouvant, France — where her works were donated to L'Artothèque; a Best in Show award at the Bonnet House Museum & Gardens in Florida; and participation in Wide Open 7, a juried exhibition affiliated with the Metropolitan Museum of Art and organized by the Brooklyn Waterfront Artists Coalition in Red Hook, New York.

Yelena's recent body of work, the visually striking "Burlap Collection," features over twenty paintings and marks a significant personal and creative breakthrough in her artistic journey.

VIRA TOLMACHEVA

From her base in Portugal, Ukrainian abstract artist Vira Tolmacheva channels her formal training and rich teaching background into vibrant canvases that pulse with rhythm, emotion, and life's enduring energy. Her intuitive works shift between fluidity and tension — a dance of line, color, and space that captures the immediacy of presence.

This abstract oil painting on canvas titled *Spring* by Ukrainian artist Vira Tolmacheva, commands attention with its dynamic interplay of colours and forms. Dominated by a soothing palette of blues, greens, and muted earth tones, the painting evokes a sense of organic movement. Splashes of pink and bold red provide striking contrast, drawing the eye to the canvas's center. The composition deftly balances chaos and harmony, with brushstrokes that are both deliberate and spontaneous, creating a textured landscape that hints at a dreamlike natural scene and stands out for its emotional intensity. Drips and splatters add depth and spontaneity, inviting us to explore the intricate layers. The use of light and dark contrasts imbues the piece with a vibrant energy, while the abstract forms suggest a fusion of land and sky, blurring reality and imagination.

OLENA CHERNIAVSKA



EMOTIONAL TURBULENCE AT FULL MOON,
Acrylic Painting and Paper Collage 12" x 36"

This artwork, entitled *EMOTIONAL TURBULENCE AT FULL MOON*, by OLENA CHERNIAVSKA, is reminiscent of traditional Japanese prints and combines intricate details with symbolic natural elements. The composition is dominated by two large harmonious circles representing the moon, each set in a vibrant landscape. Cherry blossoms and delicate branches elegantly cover the upper part, suggesting the fleeting beauty of spring. Below, dynamic waves in various shades of blue and pink fill the scene, capturing the restless energy of the ocean. These waves are interspersed with clouds, adding depth and movement. At the centre of the work emerges a serene moonlit nightscape, where the silhouettes of distant trees and a tranquil coastline contrast with the bright moon. The use of bold lines and contrasting colours creates a sense of depth and fluidity, making the work visually appealing and thematically rich, embodying the themes of nature's fleeting beauty and the interconnectedness of sky, sea, and land.

This digital artwork entitled *OCEAN OF LIGHT* by artist OLGA FOTINICH presents a fascinating blend of fluidity and dynamism, capturing the viewer's imagination with its ethereal presence. Undulating waves of colour, primarily blue, gold, and shades of bright green, create a mosaic of movement reminiscent of flowing fabric or translucent water currents. The composition is characterized by a fascinating play of light and shadow, which enhances its depth and three-dimensionality. Each fold contributes to creating a kind of dance, inviting the observer into a serene yet vibrant environment. This abstract work exudes serenity and energy and invites contemplation and connection with the multifaceted beauty of nature. This captivating artwork entitled *OCEANIC* by artist PASHYO SARKIN catches the eye with its fluid and dynamic composition, dominated by shades of blue. INTERSPACE I. Acrylic on Board, 18" x 18"

This artwork, entitled "*Interspace I*" by ROYA ADJORY, presents a vibrant fusion of abstract shapes and dynamic colours, engaging the viewer with its complex interplay of geometric forms and fluid textures. At the centre of the work is an evocative arrangement of white shapes, creating a sense of fragmentation and movement. These elements are contrasted by swirling colours—ranging from deep blues to vibrant reds and greens—that spread across the canvas, suggesting movement and energy. The juxtaposition of bold hues and softer, more translucent layers creates depth and intrigue, inviting exploration. The subtle interwoven patterns in the background add complexity, giving the artwork a sense of rhythm. THE ECHO. Oil and Concrete on Canvas, 48" x 60"

This artwork titled *THE ECHO* by ARMINEH TEIMOURIAN HAJIABADI, presents a dramatic landscape of rugged mountains, expressed through bold and textured brushstrokes. The palette features an array of blues, greys, and earth tones, conveying a sense of depth and movement. The sweeping strokes on the peaks suggest a turbulent and raw natural beauty, while lighter hues at summits evoke a play of light and shadow. The sky above, painted with subtle gradients of cream and soft gold, contrasts with the dark, formidable terrain below, creating an atmospheric tension that captures the viewer's attention. This painting titled *Butterfly Shadows* from the "Mirror Twins series" by American artist CRISTINA PAULOS is created using mixed media on canvas. The scene features two figures in the foreground floating in a landscape, where shadows, scrutinizing eyes, and butterflies emerge from a pastel green background. The entire composition has a surreal, cartoon world. The symbols in the dreamlike background accentuate the introspective attitude, vulnerability, and emotions. The shadow of the butterfly suggests change or transformation of one's double, that complex and dual state of our inner self. The combination of organic forms and delicate outlines showcases the artist's unique style, blending innocence with subtle complexity. This work captivates with its colour balance and for the emotions it conveys, inviting the viewer interpretation and reflection.

TATIANA YARTSEVA



EMOTIONAL VORTEX. Acrylic on Canvas, 13" x 10"

EMOTIONAL VORTEX by TATIANA YARTSEVA is a vibrant explosion of colour and movement, showcasing a dynamic interplay of hues that sweep across the canvas. Bold strokes of blue, green, and orange intertwine with splashes of pink and purple, creating an abstract, wave-like form that evokes the fluidity and power of nature. The textures are rich and varied, with brushstrokes ranging from smooth and flowing to rough and tumultuous, adding depth and energy to the piece. The juxtaposition of warm and cool tones provides a striking contrast, drawing the eye to the swirling, central vortex. This captivating work invites viewers to explore its depth and complexity, offering a visual journey that is both chaotic and harmonious. Its unique use of color and form captures the essence of movement, leaving a lasting impression of vigor and spontaneity.

This dynamic abstract painting titled *SWIRLS OF JOY*, bursts with vivid, swirling strokes of colour that captivate the viewer's eye. Bold arcs of blue, green, yellow, and pink dominate the canvas, interplaying with softer lavenders and creamy whites. The thick impasto technique lends a textured, almost sculptural depth to the work, as if each stroke is leaping off the surface. The energetic brushwork creates a sense of movement and spontaneity, while the harmonious colour palette provides balance and cohesion. 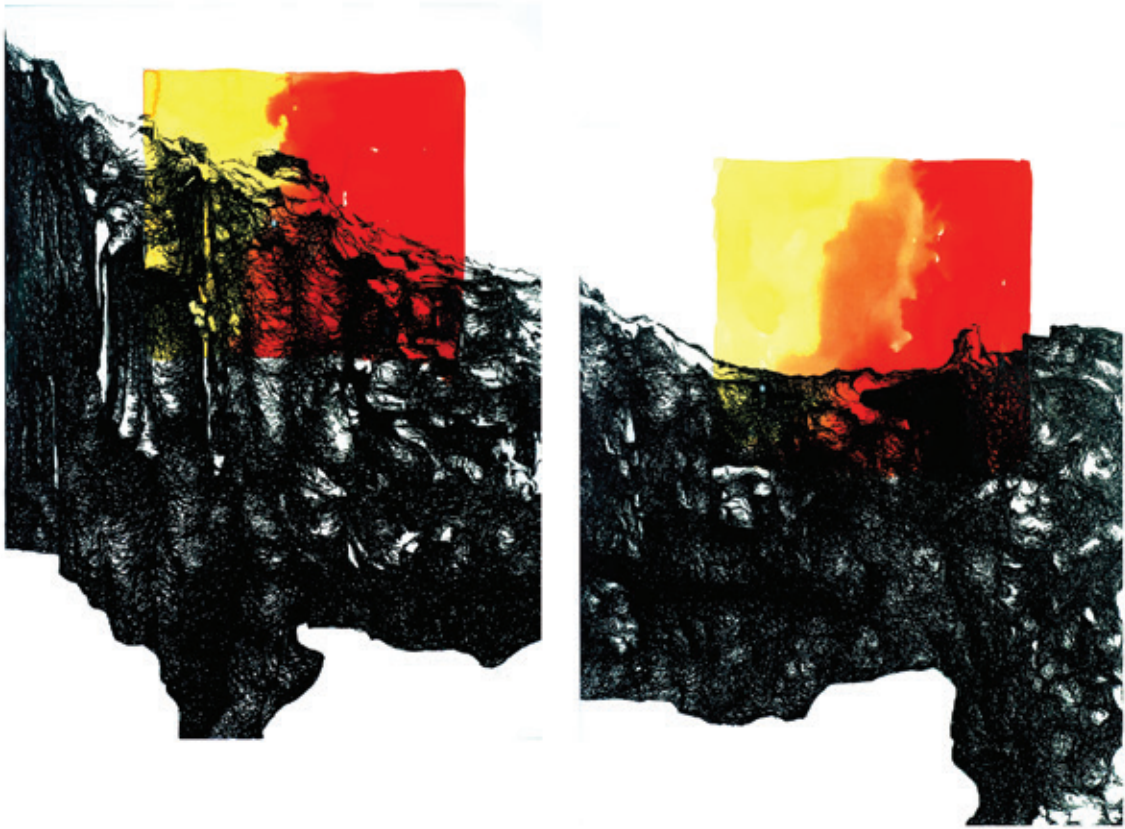

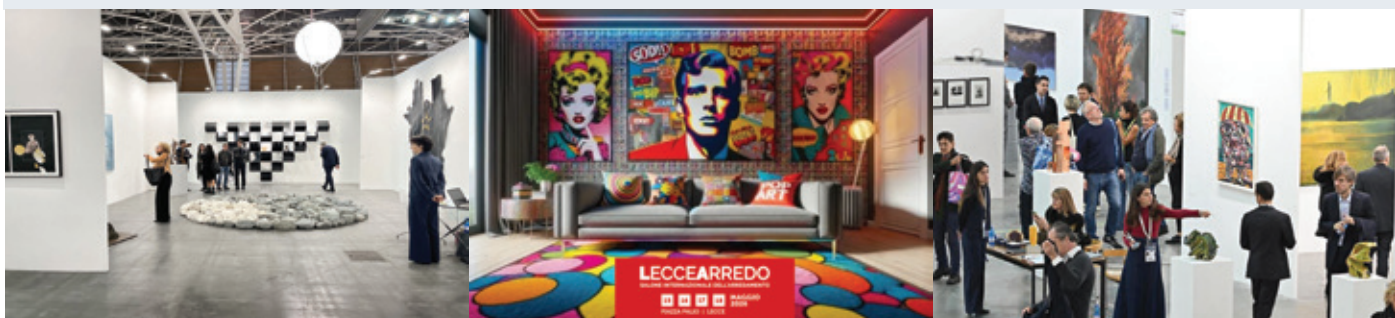

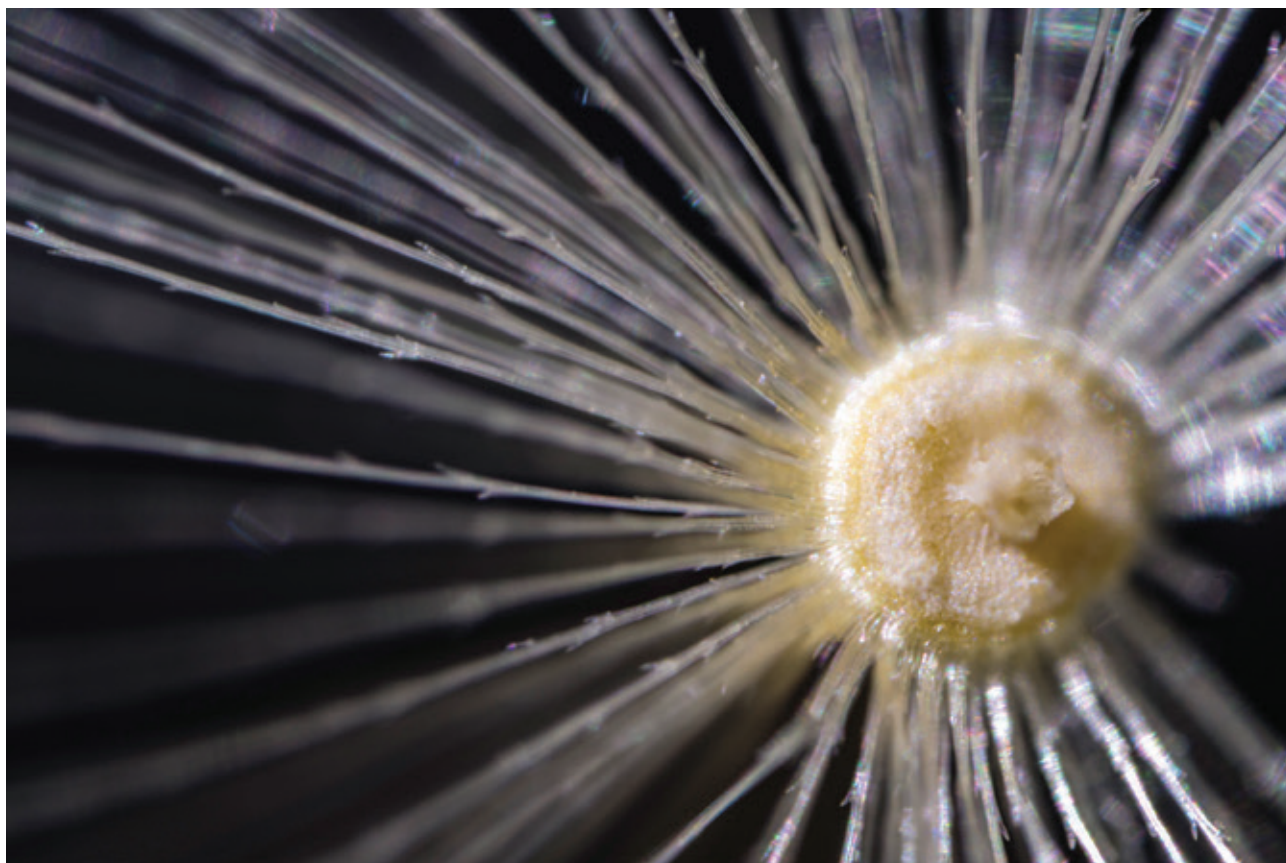

Born in Mexico City on June 10, 1968, Ioav Bakas grew up immersed in a blend of cultures thanks to his Lithuanian father and American mother. From an early age, the magic of light, objects, and cameras sparked his curiosity, patiently guided by his father, a photography enthusiast.

Although his first shots were part of a child's exploration, destiny was weaving a unique path for him. His studies in advertising and design provided valuable tools, but it wasn't until he and a colleague founded an audiovisual production studio that his mastery of the camera merged with professional creation. In a pre-digital era, they carried out meticulous work that involved capturing 36 photographs, developing slides, and later recording audio in the studio to complement the presentation.

His professional journey led him through the world of advertising in newspapers and television, and the fashion industry, until he eventually arrived at Cafebrería El Péndulo, where he currently serves as general manager.

Self-taught, he returned to the camera just as the digital revolution was transforming the industry. The ability to experiment without the limitations of development and printing costs, and the immediacy of viewing the capture on a screen, reignited his fascination. He immersed himself

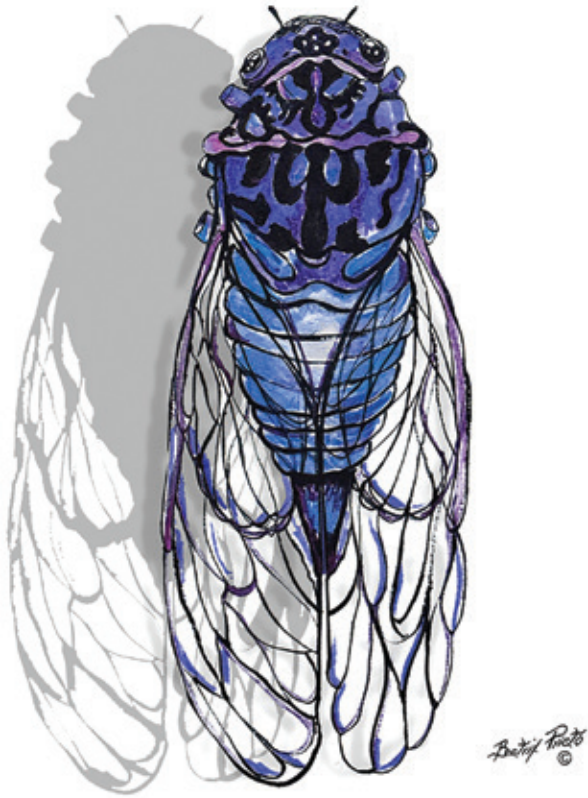

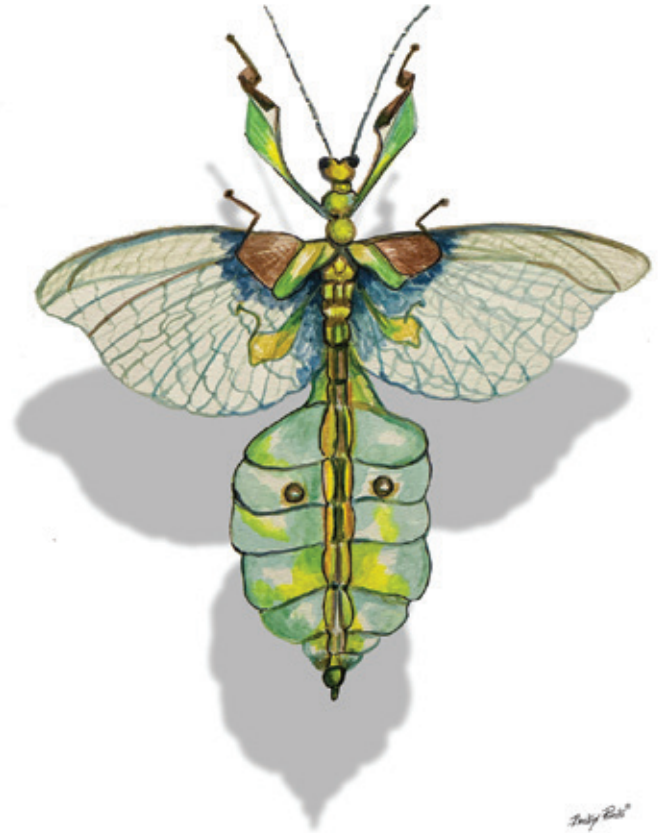

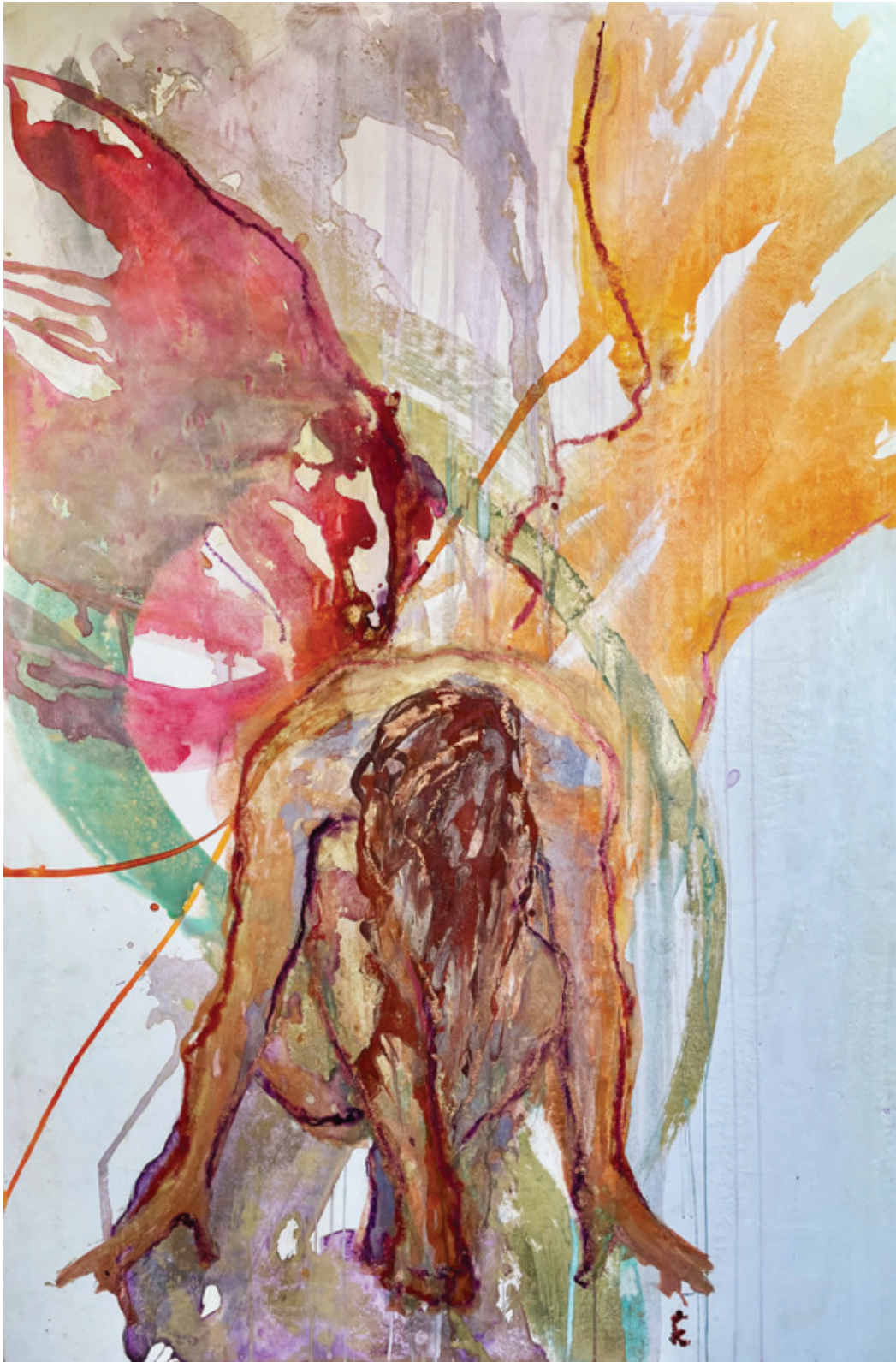
